

How to Parent Your Adopted Child

Children who have been adopted have suffered a profound heartbreak and loss: the loss of their birth family, the loss of their identity and the loss of their history. If a child is not given the opportunity to process their hurts and grieve their losses, it can cause multiple behavioral and emotional problems such as anger, sadness, hyperactivity, inattentiveness and aggression. In this training, parents will learn how to answer adoption questions, acknowledge behavioral problems respectfully, and apply easy to use interventions which will help guide their child through the process in order to develop a deeper understanding and connection with their foster or adoptive child. Workshop is recommended for parents of foster and adopted children ages 5-17.
